Theme

Since its independence in 1962, Algeria has been thriving to harmonize its diversity, chiefly through a series of linguistic amendments to its educational systems. The continuing process started long ago and culminated with the inauguration of English in primary schools, and the implementation of English in higher education and scientific research. Apart from its universal appeal, there has been a notable rise in interest in the English language within Algeria. This increased interest in English has promoted a growing recognition of the importance of English as a means to broaden horizons and connect with the wider world.
